LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS



Little Rock is the capital and the most populous city of the U.S. State of Arkansas. It is also the county seat of Pulaski County. It was incorporated on November 7, 1831. The city derives its name from a rock formation along the river, named "le petit rocher" by the French in the 1720s.

Little Rock is a cultural, economic, government, and transportation center within Arkansas and the South. Several cultural

institutions are located in Little Rock, such as the Arkansas Arts Center, the Arkansas Repertory Theatre, and the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, in addition to the hiking, boating, and other outdoor recreational opportu-



nities. Little Rock's history is available through history museums, historic districts or neighborhoods like the Quapaw Quarter, and historic sites such as Little Rock Central High School. The city is the headquarters of Dillard's, Windstream Communications, Acxiom, Stephens Inc., University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, Heifer International, the Clinton Foundation, and the Rose Law Firm.



Little Rock is home to two universities that are part of the University of Arkansas System: the campuses of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and the University of Arkansas for

Medical Sciences are located in the city. Two historically black colleges, Philander Smith College, affiliated with the United Methodist Church, and Arkansas Baptist College, are also located in Little Rock. Located in downtown is the Clinton School of Public Service, a branch of the University of Arkansas System, which offers master's degrees in public service.

Built in 1927 at a cost of \$1.5 million, Little Rock Senior High School, now Little Rock Central High School (LRCHS), was designed in the Gothic



Revival style; it was hailed as the most expensive, most beautiful, and largest high school in the nation. Statues of four figures over the front entrance represent ambition, personality, opportunity, and preparation.

At the time in Arkansas and other states across the South, public school educational facilities were legally racially segregated. In 1954 the US Supreme Court ruled in Brown v. Board of Education that such segregation in public schools was unconstitutional, and encouraged the states to integrate their schools. Related historic events in the 1950s changed education at Central High School and throughout the United States. LRCHS was the focal point of the Little Rock Integration Crisis of 1957. Nine Black students, known as the Little Rock Nine, were denied entrance to the school in defiance of the 1954 U.S. Supreme Court ruling ordering integration of public schools. [7]



In 1957, with the encouragement of Mrs. Daisy Bates, the NAACP registered nine black students to attend the previously all-white Little Rock Central High, selected on the criteria of excellent grades and attendance. Called the "Little Rock Nine", they were Ernest Green, Elizabeth Eckford, Jefferson Thomas, Terrence Roberts, Carlotta Walls LaNier), Minnijean Brown, Gloria Ray Karlmark, Thelma Mothershed, and Melba Pattillo Beals. Ernest Green was the first African American to graduate

from Central High. On the morning of September 23, 1957, the nine Black high school students faced an angry mob of over 1,000 Whites in front of Central High School who were protesting the integration project. As the students were escorted inside by the Little Rock police, violence escalated, and they were removed from the school. The next day, President Dwight D. Eisenhower ordered the 1,200-man 327th Airborne Battle Group of the U.S. Army's 101st Airborne Division from Fort Campbell, Kentucky, to escort the nine students into the school. As Melba Pattillo Beals, one of the nine students, wrote in her diary, "After three full days inside Central [High School], I know that integration is a much bigger word than I thought."

On November 6, 1998, Congress established Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site. The National Historic Site is administered in partnership with the National Park Service, Little Rock Public Schools, the City of Little Rock, and others. The Visitor Center for the site is located diagonally across the street from the school. Opposite the Visitor Center to the west is the Central High Commemorative Garden, which features nine trees and benches that honor the students. Arches that represent the school's facade contain embedded photographs of the school in years since the crisis, and showcase students of various backgrounds in activities together.

In 2007, Central High School held an event for the 50th Anniversary of the Little Rock Nine entering Central. On September 24, 2007, a new museum was opened honoring the Little Rock Nine. That same year, HBO produced a documentary film directed by the Renaud Brothers, Little Rock Central: 50 Years Later, which explored the significant changes and continuities within the school since its desegregation.

The William J. Clinton Presidential Center and Park is the presidential library of Bill Clinton, the 42nd President of the United States (1993–2001). It is located in Little Rock, Arkansas and includes the Clinton Presidential Library, the offices of the Clinton Foundation, and the University of Arkansas Clinton School

of Public Service. It is the thirteenth presidential library to have been completed in the United States, the eleventh to be operated by the National Archives and Records Administration,[1] [2] and the third to comply with the Presidential Records Act of 1978.

After the location for the project was announced, many new businesses began to develop in the surrounding area. Numerous hotels, restaurants, housing complexes, offices, retail stores



were established. The revived River Market district, a dining and retail area near the library, was created as a result of its location. In addition, over \$1 billion of new real estate has been invested in downtown Little Rock. The world headquarters of Heifer International is located just beyond the library.

The center has spurred an estimated \$2 billion in new projects in the surrounding parts of Little Rock. Since its opening, the library has had over 1.64 million visitors. The museum had 302,583 visitors in 2009 and 273,108 visitors in 2008. There were approximately 500,000 visitors during its first year (November 2004 - 2005).

CANCELLATION REQUEST and REFUND POLICY

All Registration Fees paid on or before the deadline are refundable. Please be aware that a Cancellation Fee will be deducted from the registration and/or ticket amount paid. All funds for approved for cancellation requests will be reimbursed within ninety (90) days after the conclusion of Conclave. Emergency Cancellation Requests will be reviewed individually when accompanied by a letter written to Headquarters accompanied by proper documentation from the Chapter Basileus. The amount of the approved refund will be considered based on the Postmark Date of the request. See the chart below for Refund Amount Percentage for lost revenue.

NO SHOW POLICY

No refunds will be granted when a Registered Soror does not show up for the Conclave. The exception will be a documented emergency, which will be considered on an individual case by case basis. The Conclave Materials packet for the absent Soror will be given to the Chapter Basileus if a Refund was not requested in accordance with the Cancellation and Refund Policy.

REGISTRATION TRANSFER POLICY

The Registration Fee will be transferred from one Registered Soror to another only with a written request from the Chapter Basileus and Chapter Tamiouchos and signed request from the two members, prior to the start of Conclave. A Soror may request a Transfer of Registration to another Soror to avoid the cancellation fee. The Soror must be in good financial standing. A letter must be sent to Headquarters requesting the Transfer of Registration.
